Our school has decided to make a commitment to purposeful and regular land based learning outdoors. In addition, we will infuse Medicine Wheel teachings, the Indigenous Education Helistic Litelong Learning Framework

and the <u>Indigenous Education Holistic Lifelong Learning Framework Companion Guide for Schools</u> in more meaningful and in-depth ways across the curriculum.
